DSLIM Foundation Activity Report (2025)

Founded in 2023, the DSLIM Foundation is dedicated to strengthening the capacity of individuals and organizations while enhancing the overall well-being of local communities. The Foundation operates by leveraging the human and institutional resources of World Mission University, fostering meaningful engagement with diverse community partners. Through a wide range of workshops and seminars, DSLIM Foundation responds to community needs and continues to grow as a family-centered, community-driven initiative.

In 2025, a total of 362 participants engaged in DSLIM Foundation–hosted workshops and seminars. Key areas of focus included ministries supporting individuals with disabilities and their families, as well as parent support programs. Notably, the Foundation strengthened partnerships with disability-focused organizations within the Korean American community, including Young Nak Presbyterian Church (Hope Ministry) and Milal Mission of Southern California. Building on these collaborations, DSLIM Foundation plans to expand its outreach by partnering with a broader network of disability service organizations across the region.

Program Evaluation Summary (2025.1.1~12.31)

An analysis of the 2025 program outcomes indicates consistently strong engagement and high participant satisfaction across all offerings.

- **Participation Overview:** In 2025, all programs were delivered online, resulting in 100% online participation. This format significantly enhanced accessibility and supported sustained engagement among participants.

- **Overall Satisfaction with Seminars and Workshops:** Survey results indicate that 100% of respondents reported being either "satisfied" or "very satisfied." Participants also expressed a high level of satisfaction with the practical relevance and applicability of the content. In particular, the Foundation's seminars were evaluated as highly effective in delivering realistic, experience-based content tailored to parents and caregivers of individuals with disabilities, rather than focusing solely on theoretical knowledge.

- **Overall Satisfaction with Understanding and Ministry of Christian Disability Studies**
Certificate Program: The participants in this program were primarily church volunteers, followed by pastors and parents of individuals with disabilities. Among the 56 participants, 21.4% of the participants were male and 78.6% were female. Regarding participant background, 51.8% were community members with an interest in disability ministry, 30.4%

were professionals engaged in disability-related ministries or pastoral work, and 17.8% were parents of children with disabilities.

- **Theology of Disability and the Church:** This course significantly contributed to participants' understanding of theological perspectives on disability. A high proportion of respondents reported strong satisfaction, indicating that the course effectively supported theological reflection, conceptual clarity, and faith-based engagement.

- **Introduction to Disability Studies:** This course facilitated meaningful shifts in participants' perceptions of disability and contributed to increased awareness and attitudinal change. The results indicate that the course was effective in promoting inclusive thinking and deeper social understanding.

- **Disability Ministry and Field Research:** This course received particularly high ratings for practical applicability and overall satisfaction, with a notably high proportion of respondents awarding the highest score (5 points). Participants emphasized that the content was directly applicable to real-life ministry contexts.

- **Disability and Family Ministry:** This course provided participants with deeper understanding and emotional insight into families of persons with disabilities. It received high satisfaction ratings for content delivery and relevance. Participants especially valued its practical focus and applicability to real-life family ministry contexts.

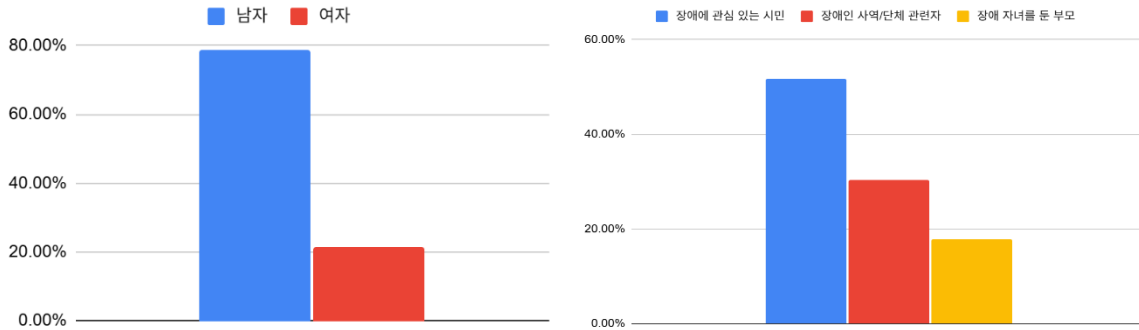
Overall Evaluation Summary

Overall, the 2025 programs demonstrated consistently high levels of satisfaction across all courses, with particularly strong outcomes in areas of professional relevance, practical application, and participant engagement. The programs effectively supported both theological reflection and practical ministry development, contributing meaningfully to participant's understanding of disability, family engagement, and inclusive ministry practices.

These results indicate that the 2025 educational initiatives successfully fulfilled their intended goals and provide a strong foundation for future program development and expansion.

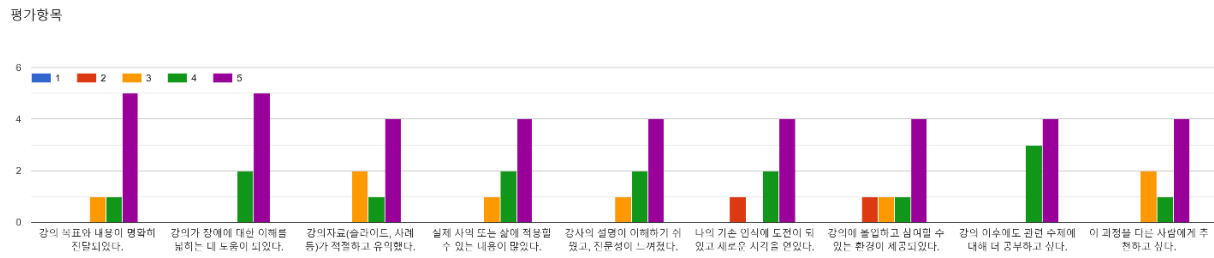

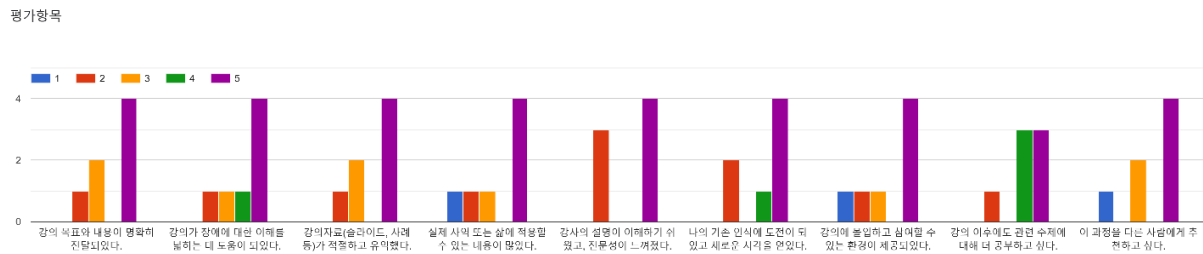


* Course Satisfaction Results (1=Strongly Disagree, 5= Strongly Agree)

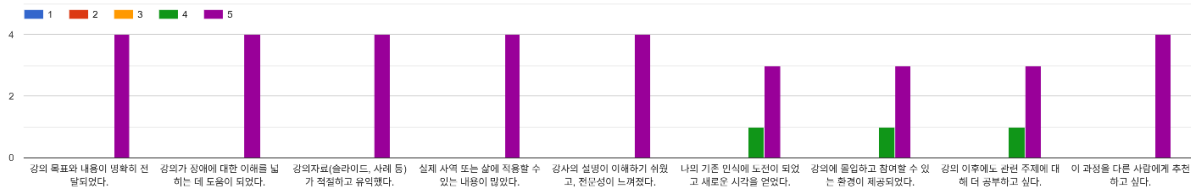

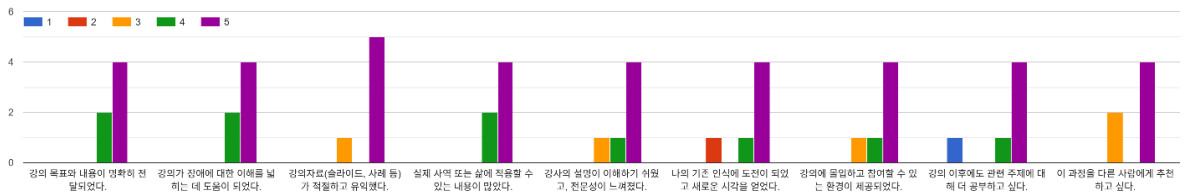

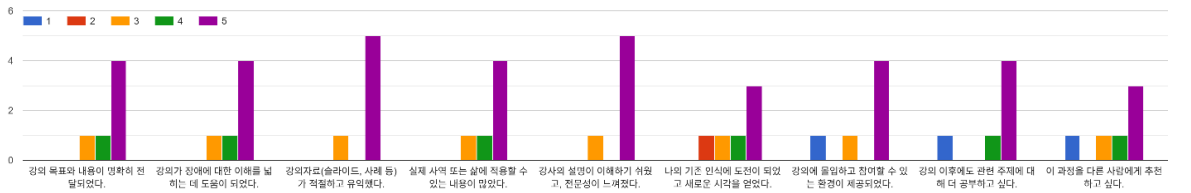
<Disability and Family Ministry Part 1>

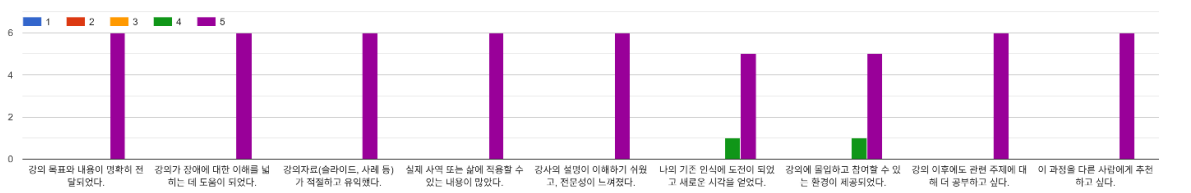
<Disability and Family Ministry Part 2>

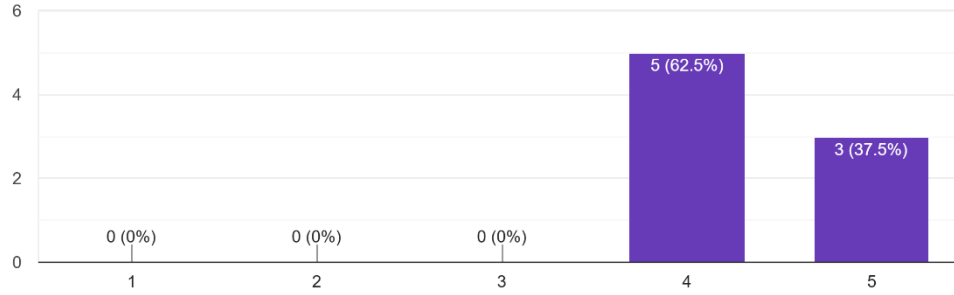

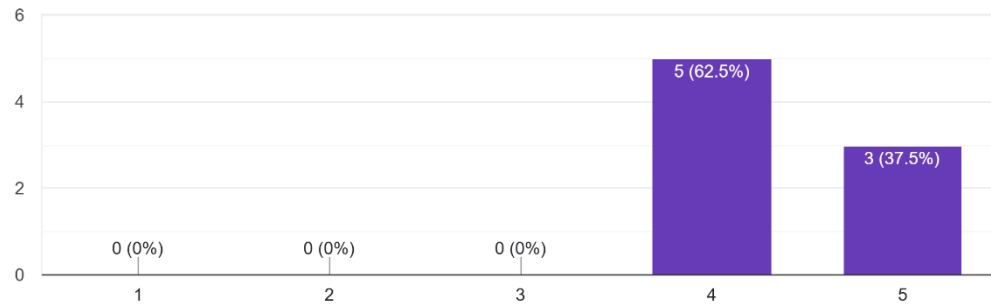

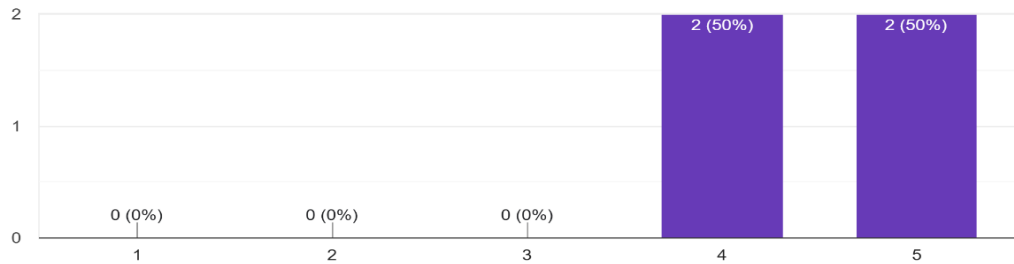

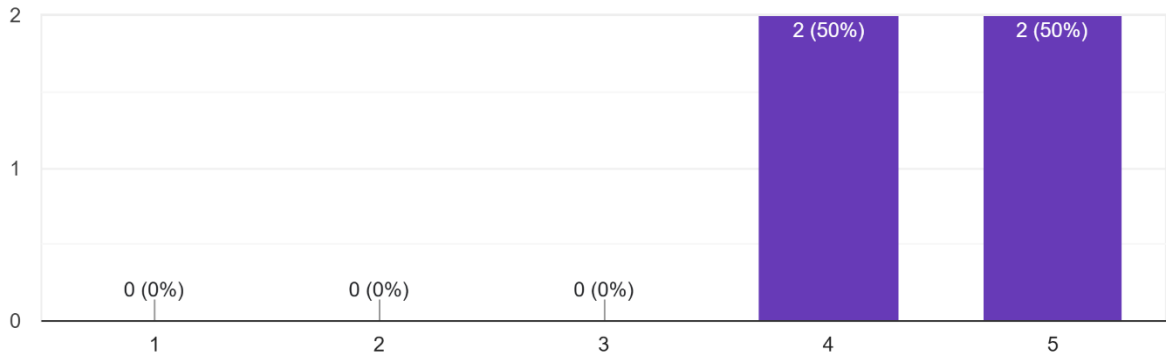
